FEMA encourages all survivors who sustained disaster-related damage or losses to apply for assistance **before the Dec. 13 deadline:**

- Go online to DisasterAssistance.gov or [Disaster Assistance.gov/es](http://DisasterAssistance.gov/es) (for Spanish)
- Call **(800) 621-3362** or **(800) 462-7585** (TTY) anytime from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. local time seven days a week until further notice. Multilingual operators are available.
- Visit a disaster recovery center. To find center locations and current hours, download the FEMA mobile app in English and Spanish, the ReadyNC app, or visit FEMA.gov/DRC. Center hours and operations are adjusted based on visitor demand.
- In-person American Sign Language (ASL) interpreters are available by calling or texting (202) 655-8824. Go online to watch a video on how to Request an American Sign Language interpreter. The LIEAP, or Low Income Energy Assistance Program, provides a one-time annual vendor payment to help eligible families offset winter heating expenses. The household's total countable income for the base period must be equal to or less than 130 percent of the current poverty level, and the household's total resources must be \$2,250 or less. Applicants must provide all income for the household and its members; checking and savings account statements for all members of the household; all property, stocks, bonds and other assets for all members of the household; the name, date of birth and social security number for each member of the household; and a copy of the current heating source bill, with the applicant's name, address and account number.
